Dr. Schoberl will officially start as Head of School on August 1, 2021. We believe he is an extraordinary fit for the culture of the school and the region.

Dr. Schoberl comes to Ashbrook from Crystal Springs Uplands School in the Bay Area of California. As Head of Middle School, he led the team that successfully built the preeminent 6-8th grade middle school program in the Bay Area. As Senior Advancement Officer, Dr. Schoberl built skill sets in the areas of Fundraising, Alumni Affairs, Admissions, Parent Relations, and Communications and Strategy that will serve Ashbrook well.



Prior to his time at Crystal Springs, Dr. Schoberl held a series of leadership roles of gradually increasing responsibility. He was an

English Teacher at Delbarton School in NJ; an English Department Chair and Teacher at Foxcroft School in VA where he was awarded an endowed chair for excellence in teaching; the Academic Dean in charge of K-9 curriculum, professional development, and learning support at Fay School in MA; and the Principal of the Middle School at Trinity School in NYC where he also taught English and Art History and coached lacrosse. Finally, Dr. Schoberl brings to Ashbrook his experience as the founding Head of School of the K-8 Ben Franklin Classical Charter School in MA where he also taught Latin.

Dr. Schoberl holds a doctorate in Educational Administration with a focus in Private School Leadership from Columbia University. His dissertation was entitled "The Creation and Evaluation of a Computer Network for the Professional Development of Independent School Educators." He also holds two master's degrees--a master of arts in Teaching and a master of arts in Education from Columbia University--and a bachelor of arts in Psychology from Rutgers University.



Dr. Schoberl will move to Corvallis next summer with his wife, Eileen. They share three grown children: Ethan, Molly, and Zachary.
