### Please do your part to keep us all safe


As everyone settles into the new way of school, work, and life it is very easy to start to fall back into some old habits and forget the increasing importance of maintaining all the safety practices we've all worked hard to put in place this year. Please do your part to help us stay in school by following the expectations below every single day. We need your help!

- Wear a face covering correctly (over nose and mouth), cover your cough, and wash your hands. These standard COVID-19 prevention measures are still the number one priority to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- Continue to **minimize non-essential trips**. Reducing the number of daily interactions you have with others outside your household reduces the risk of encountering someone with COVID-19.
- **Gather socially only with the same group**, aka 'pod.' Choose 2-3 households, or 5-10 people, that you trust to create a closed loop each household in the pod does not have physical contact with households outside the pod.
- **Get a flu shot.** Although the flu vaccine does not protect you from COVID-19, the symptoms of influenza and COVID-19 can be similar. Protect yourself from the flu this fall and winter by getting a flu vaccine. Standard COVID-19 prevention measures will protect you from both flu and COVID-19.

- 4th grade- parents will drop off in fire lane for screening at 1:45 and park in the lot until their students are released back to them at 2:00

- 7th/8th grade parents will drop off in fire lane for screening at 3:35 and pick up in the same spot from 4:15-4:30

#### **Current Metrics**

According to the Benton County Health Department and the Oregon Department of Education, we are able to continue with in-person classes for K-3 as long as we have no positive cases within our school community unless directed otherwise by the Benton County Health Department.

The metrics for grades 4-8 returning to the building remain the same: Benton County must have fewer than 10 cases per 100,000 and a test positivity rate of under 5% for 3 consecutive weeks.
