
# Ashbrook Compass

# If You Plan to Travel, Plan to Quarantine

When it comes to traveling this holiday season, the Oregon Health Authority and Benton County Health Department recommend that you:

- Stay at least 6 feet away from other people who are not in your household, both indoors and outdoors.
- Wear a mask to keep your nose and mouth covered when you are outside of your home.
- Wash your hands often or use hand sanitizer.
- Look for symptoms of COVID-19, and take your temperature daily for 14 days.

If you travel out of state:

- Self-quarantine for 14 days upon returning to Oregon even if you do not feel sick or have symptoms.
- Consider getting tested for COVID-19.

### **Current COVID Metrics**

ODE and OHA require that schools transition to online learning when cases exceed 100 per 100,000 over a 2-week period. At this time, Benton County is now in the red category with 301 cases per 100,000 for the 11/29 to 12/12 time frame. The Benton County Health Department does not recommend any school to be open for in-person learning at this time.
