

Dear Families,

Ashbrook Independent School is up for renewal of our Accreditation Certification. We are currently accredited by Cognia (formerly known as AdvancEd) but our 5-year certification expires during the 2020-2021 school year. Last year, we assembled a team of Ashbrook educators to begin the preparation for our accreditation year. Our Student Engagement Team met monthly to plan, develop materials, analyze data, and summarize findings in order to create a new 5-year School Improvement Plan.

The following was used to determine our priorities for improvement as a school community:

- Surveys (students, parents, staff)
- IOWA assessments
- Future thinking trends and letters from students
- Attendance and behavior records
- Historical school data
- Classroom observations

On January 25th and 26th, Cognia will be visiting Ashbrook (virtually) to review all of the materials, documents, data, and future plans, and they will interview all stakeholder groups in order to determine our accreditation renewal qualifications.

K-3 return to In-Person Learning

The Oregon Department of Education, Oregon Health Authority, and Benton County Health Department have updated us on their guidance for returning students to the building safely. Ashbrook will continue to follow the advisory metrics.

Under the guidance, we are able to return grades K-3 back to in-person learning with county case rates below 350 per 100,000. We feel confident with our protocols to make this happen as safely as possible.

Every week since September, schools across Oregon who have been open to limited in-person learning (including AIS) have been submitting data to ODE about case rates in the school. The data has shown that the risk of spread in a school is very low if schools follow the Ready Schools Safe Learners guidance.

Ashbrook's small size has many benefits, especially during this pandemic, however, due to our small size we are unable to provide a full comprehensive online program while simultaneously teaching students in-person. With that said, we remain committed to doing our best to meet the needs of our families during this time.

Current COVID Metrics

At this time, Benton County is in the orange category with 320 cases per 100,000 for the 1/3/20 - 1/16/21 time frame. ODE and OHA advise that elementary schools can prioritize careful phasing in of on-site or hybrid learning with county case rates less than 350 over a 2-week period, and schools are not advised to reduce in-person learning or return to distance learning based on metrics as long as the school can demonstrate the ability to limit transmission in the school environment.
