
Ashbrook Compass

*Per OHA guidelines: If you plan to travel out-of-state or out of the country over Spring Break, we expect your student to be quarantined for 14 days upon return, as it is the safest option to prevent the spread of Covid-19 to others. However, they may come back to school after 10 days if they do not experience any symptoms or after 7 days if they receive a negative test result from an antigen or polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test that was conducted within 48 hours of the end of the 7-day period.

Continuing Return to School Update

The 4th and 5th grade students will be starting in-person classes on Monday, March 8th! We are on track to continue to follow our projected timeline for returning the 6th graders on March 15th and the 7th/8th graders on March 29th. Mrs. Sechler is meeting with each grade level a few days prior to their return date to talk through some of the new routines to expect. She has also created a parent version of the new routines to be shared with each grade level as their return date approaches. Also, if your student has seasonal allergies:

- what symptoms to expect must be documented for your student since allergy symptoms mimic some of the COVID Primary and Non-Primary symptoms. Otherwise your student must remain home and be symptom-free for 48 hours. Email Carol with student name and symptoms.
- please administer any needed medications at home to limit Staff contact with your student.
- if medication must be administered at school, this form must be completed and dropped off with the medication in the bin outside the front doors.

As your student returns to the building (or if they already have), please return any Chromebooks and chargers borrowed from Ashbrook. We will need those computers for in-person middle school classes. You can drop them off in the box by the front door.

IT Specialist Update



The 7th graders were prompted to answer the question, "What does your childhood taste like?"


