We will continue to accept enrollment contracts, however, your student's place is not reserved without this completed contract. If you have submitted your contract then you should receive an email from MSP shortly notifying you that your enrollment deposit has been pushed to your MSP cart. Your student is considered fully enrolled once the deposit is paid.

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## **Board of Trustees Update**

In keeping with our practice of open and transparent communication with the Ashbrook community, here are the highlights from the March 18, 2021 Board meeting:

- The Board reviewed the progress of current enrollment activity for AY21-22. The school is seeing strong interest for the next academic year. There are still openings in many classes, the Board believes that word of mouth recommendations from members of the Ashbrook Community is one of our strongest promotional tools and we encourage all members of the Ashbrook community to recommend our school to others prospective families.
- The Board discussed a suicide prevention policy and plan for Ashbrook to ensure we are able to support the emotional health of our students at every level.

- The Board will be establishing a working group focused on Board policy; we discussed expanding the working group to other Ashbrook parents outside of the Board of Trustees. If you have experience in writing or shaping policy and are interested in being a part of this working group, please let us know.
- There was agreement on having a Board retreat in May and discussion about the associated deliverables and outcomes for the retreat.
- The Board discussed school finances. We are in the process of finalizing and submitting our application for a 2nd PPP loan.
- The Board discussed the upcoming visit by our new HOS, Chris Schoberl, to Corvallis on April 5th (Mon) to April 7th (Wed). If you are interested in meeting with Chris, please let us know and we will connect you.

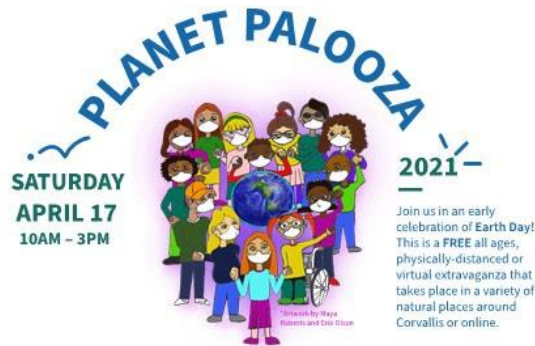

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## **Current COVID Information**

At this time, Benton County has 116.6 cases per 100,000 for the 3/14/20 - 3/27/21 time frame.

If your student has been exposed to COVID, we expect your student to be quarantined for 14 days. However, they may come back to school after 10 days if they do not experience any symptoms or after 7 days if they receive a negative test result from an antigen or polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test that was conducted within 48 hours of the end of the 7-day period.
